The True Cost of a Mile of Road

When we drive down a freshly paved street, it's easy to take smooth asphalt for granted. But behind every mile of roadway is a significant investment—not just to build it, but to keep it safe and drivable year after year. On average, constructing one mile of a two-lane urban road can cost between \$2 million and \$5 million, depending on land conditions, materials, and traffic needs. Wider arterial roads, bridges, or highways push that cost much higher. Even a "simple" residential street requires surveying, drainage, curbs, and sidewalks in addition to the pavement itself. Once built, the real work begins. Roads wear down quickly under constant use, weather, and freeze—thaw cycles. Maintenance costs typically break down like this:

*Routine maintenance (patching potholes, crack sealing, striping): \$5,000-\$15,000 per mile per year.

*Resurfacing (new layer of asphalt every 10-15 years): \$150,000-\$300,000 per mile.

*Full reconstruction (when the base fails, every 25-30 years): \$1 million or more per mile.

Over its lifetime, the cost of maintaining a single mile of road often equals or exceeds its original construction cost. Every tax dollar invested in roads supports not only smoother commutes but also:

*Lower vehicle costs (less wear-and-tear on tires and suspensions).

*Improved safety (well-maintained roads reduce accidents).

*Economic vitality (businesses, schools, and emergency services depend on reliable access).

Preventive care—like sealing cracks or resurfacing on time—saves money long-term by extending a road's life. Studies show that \$1 spent on timely maintenance can save \$4-\$10 in future reconstruction costs.

Orange Township residents will see a .5 mil levy on the ballot this fall that would go directly to repairs and maintenance for the township's 112 miles of roadway. This is a 2 year levy that will generate an additional 1.1M annually for the resurfacing of township streets. A recent study showed that nearly 25% of township roads are candidates for resurfacing while another 63% are in need of preventative maintenance.
